**CITY OF KLAWOCK
PROCLAMATION OF
EMERGENCY ORDER #EO-02
IN RESPONSE TO COVID-19**

ISSUED BY THE MAYOR OF CITY OF KLAWOCK ("CITY") PURSUANT TO CITY OF KLAWOCK EMERGENCY ORDINANCE #EO2020-03 AND ORDINANCE 1.02.050.

The COVID-19 pandemic has generated a public health emergency that still threatens to overwhelm the health system of the entire State of Alaska. Furthermore, the City has limited health resources, and we must continue to take steps to slow and contain the threat; such steps require coordinated community action. This order is issued to preserve the health and safety of our community.

PURSUANT TO THE AUTHORITY GRANTED TO ME BY THE CITY COUNCIL UNDER EMERGENCY ORDINANCE #EO2020-03 AND CITY CODE OF ORDINANCES SECTION 1.02.050 (EMERGENCY ORDINANCES), I HEREBY PROCLAIM THE FOLLOWING EMERGENCY REGULATIONS TO BE EFFECTIVE AS OF 11:59 P.M. ON TUESDAY, MAY 19, 2020, TO PRESERVE LIFE IN AND ADJACENT TO THE CITY. THE FOLLOWING EMERGENCY REGULATIONS HAVE THE POWER OF LAW, SHALL REMAIN IN EFFECT UNTIL 11:59 P.M. ON FRIDAY, JUNE 19, 2020, AND SHALL SUPERSEDE ALL CONFLICTING LAWS DURING THE EXISTENCE OF THIS EMERGENCY.

1. All residents of the City are strongly encouraged to hunker down and shelter in place as much as possible, in order to minimize any spread of COVID-19.
2. Residents should stay home and work from home as much as possible, except to work in "Essential Services/Critical Infrastructure" jobs (as defined in the State of Alaska COVID-19 Mandate 018 (<ps://covid19.alaska.gov/wp-content/uploads/2020/05/05112020-COVID-MANDATE-018-Intrastate-Travel.pdf>)); to buy, sell, or deliver groceries or other critical goods; to receive or provide health care; and to get fresh air without coming within 6 feet of non-household members.
3. The City encourages residents to continue to conduct business via telephone or electronic communications as much as possible.
4. On the limited occasions when individuals leave their home, it is strongly recommended that they practice recommended hygiene, maintain social distancing of at least 6 feet from any person outside their household whenever possible, and wear masks when maintaining a 6-foot



distance is impractical, including, without limitation, when in offices, business establishments, and the City's liquor store.

5. It is strongly recommended, in accordance with the Center for Disease Control guidance, that certain residents should take even greater precaution: Anyone particularly at-risk from COVID-19 should reduce exposure by staying home, not physically going to work, and not doing their own shopping, if possible. These include any individuals 60 years of age and older, and individuals with a serious underlying medical condition. Members of households with these individuals should also implement and follow these more stringent guidelines.
6. If you are sick or suspect you may have the COVID-19 virus, and have a fever, cough or difficulty breathing, call your healthcare provider, and immediately isolate anyone who is ill. Help prevent the disease from spreading to people in your home and our community.
7. Since the City is a community that is not on the "Road System" nor directly served by the "Marine Highway System," individuals who have traveled into the City from any other Alaskan city are strongly urged to quarantine in their homes for a period of 14-days. See State of Alaska Health Mandate 018: Travel to the City is restricted, except as necessary for "Critical Personal Needs," and the conduct of "Essential Services/Critical Infrastructure." 8. Travelers through the City shall follow the State of Alaska Health Mandate 018(V) Precautions while traveling:
 - Stops shall be minimized on the way to the final destination.
 - If travelers must stop for food, gas, or supplies, only 1 traveler shall engage with the third-party vendor. All travelers must practice social distancing by keeping 6 feet away from others when possible, and avoid crowded places whenever possible. Cloth face coverings should be used whenever a traveler engages with a third-party vendor(s).
 - Travelers, traveling by car or vehicle, who have to stop shall wash their hands or use hand sanitizer before exiting, and immediately after returning to, the car or vehicle.
9. Residents must comply with the [State of Alaska Health Mandate 10.1- International and Interstate Travel- mandatory Order for Self-Quarantine](#).
10. All businesses, whether Essential Services/Critical Infrastructure or non-essential/non-critical, that have staff traveling between Klawock and other communities must file with the State of Alaska, and provide a copy to the City, a protective plan, consistent with State of Alaska Health Mandate 018: (<ps://covid19.alaska.gov/wp-content/uploads/2020/05/05112020-COVID-MANDATE-018-Intrastate-Travel.pdf>), to avoid the spread of COVID-19, and not endanger the lives in the City.
11. Residents shall follow all health mandates issued by Governor Dunleavy, the Alaska Department of Health and Human Services (DHSS), and the U.S. Center for Disease Control (CDC). (<https://covid19.alaska.gov/health-mandates/>
